WRITER'S WORKSHOP



PULLING STRINGS Part II

In keeping with Rudy Keil's recent contribution, I have this to offer. During the workshop meeting, where the topic came up, we discussed all the ways we could apply "pulling strings" in everyday life. There's the loose thread on a sweater that's sure to come undone if we succumb to the urge to "pull that string." My mind immediately leaps toward politics. Illinois has the reputation as the most corrupt state in the union and most of that governance has its origins in Chicago. I grew up in Chicago so I'm only too familiar with pulling strings. I learned those lessons very early in life. My grammar school was about a block away from our local alderman's office and even at the early age of 12, or 13 we were aware of clout. How does clout relate to pulling strings? Back in the old days, before plastic garbage cans, we used 55 gallon steel

drums for garbage. These steel drums were an improvement to the cast concrete containers that had to be emptied with a shovel. Not everyone had access to these drums except through the city/alderman. At this point in my life Martin H. Kennelly was established as the king of the city and the aldermen had their fiefdoms within that kingdom. He was considered too conservative, and so Richard J. Daley became the new king in 1955. Ah now comes the strings. If you needed the aforementioned garbage can you went, hat in hand, to the alderman to ask for it. He (I don't think we had any women alderpersons back then) would take it under consideration. Getting a Republi-can ballot in the last primary meant you could wait a long time for that can. The wait was something on the order of Hades freezing over, or the Cubs winning the World Series. Both had about the same probability.

Now should you need something along the lines of a zoning change, a liquor license, or a city job? This took some serious "string pulling." This required contributions to the re-election campaign of all those elected officials involved, as well as Twinkies and hot chocolate for half the staff that wasn't elected. As I'm writing this I realized that not much has changed in the past 50 plus years. There's still a Daley in office at the time I write this, at least for another month, and clout is alive and well as evidenced by many of today's newspaper articles and editorials.

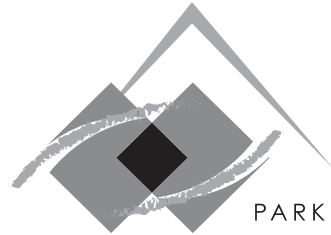
